Overview





Course Length

- AIEP is a nine-level, full-time program
- 10 weeks in winter, spring, and fall
- 6 or 12 weeks in the summer
- 23 class sessions per week

Curriculum

- Core classes: grammar, reading, writing, listening, and presentation skills. Advanced levels earn 11 transferable university credits in 10- and 12-week sessions.
- Advanced students are eligible to enroll in additional credit-bearing UCLA daytime and UCLA Extension evening classes.
- Elective classes at high-intermediate and advanced levels, including: TOEFL, IELTS, GRE, Business English, Pronunciation, Public Speaking, Current Events, and others.

For Students Who Want To

- Improve their English pronunciation, spoken grammar, and listening comprehension.
- Gain confidence in the ability to communicate with native speakers.

Course Length

- IECP is a three-level full-time program
- Four-week programs year-around, 11-week summer session
- 20 class sessions per week
- Three-week session at the end of the summer
- Students can enroll for four, eight, or 12 weeks per quarter, for up to nine consecutive quarters, with new study material in each four-week session.

Description of Levels

- Three levels: intermediate prep, intermediate, and advanced
- Students at the basic level may be reassigned to the Academic Intensive English Program.

American Culture & Communication Course (ACC)

- This course is for part-time IECP study only and does not qualify for F-1 student visas.
- Designed for individuals and groups who are in Los Angeles for tourism, business, or family visits.






Certificate Programs for International Students

A certificate is a sequence of courses related to a specialized field or topic such as General Business Studies, Marketing, Entertainment Studies, Project Management, Digital Technology, Sustainability, and Journalism.

Certificate programs are not degree programs; however, many Americans who have bachelor's and master's degrees enroll in certificate programs to advance or change their careers.

UCLA Extension certificate programs are usually taught by working professionals who are experts in their fields; programs offer a practical, real-world approach to each field of study.



Program Overview

We offer over 40 F-1 visa-approved certificate programs that allow international students to study full-time in the U.S.

Exceptional Quality

UCLA Extension certificate programs meet UCLA standards of excellence and are approved by the UCLA Academic Senate.

Program Duration (mostly 6–12 months)

Longer programs offer a deeper understanding of each field.

Reasonable Fees

UCLA Extension programs are a great value; course fees for American and international students are the same.

Studying with Americans

International students study side by side with American students and receive the same high level of instruction.

Cross-Cultural Understanding / Language Proficiency

Living in Los Angeles, studying at UCLA Extension, and experiencing American life increases students' proficiency in English and their cross-cultural awareness.

Outstanding Instructors

Industry experts provide practical perspectives on the day-to-day realities of each field of study.



Curricular Practical Training (CPT)

This internship directly relates to your certificate program. Offered as a course, the internship allows you to gain work experience in your field. To qualify for CPT, you must be enrolled in a program that offers the internship course, and you must complete nine months of full-time study in your program.

Optional Practical Training (OPT)

Get up to one year of paid work experience in the U.S. after you have successfully completed a certificate program lasting at least nine months.





Program Overview

The Study Abroad at UCLA Program is designed for international students who are currently enrolled in a bachelor's degree program in their home country and want to earn transferable academic credits.

For Students Who Want To

- Earn academic credit you can transfer to your university.
- Enroll in UCLA undergraduate daytime and UCLA Extension evening courses.
- Study side by side with American students, working professionals, and other international students.

In order to meet international student visa requirements, students must enroll in a minimum of 12 units of UCLA and/or UCLA Extension credit.

UCLA and UCLA Extension operate on the quarter system, with four 11-week sessions per year—fall, winter, spring, and summer. Study Abroad at UCLA offers UCLA Extension courses all four quarters and UCLA courses only in fall, winter, and spring. To enroll in summer UCLA courses, students can enroll in UCLA Summer Sessions by going to summer.ucla.edu. Students often stay for more than one quarter and it is easy to transfer between Study Abroad at UCLA and UCLA Summer Sessions.



Students can enroll in Study Abroad at UCLA only through specific Study Abroad consulting offices or university partners.






